From 1989 to 1995, Robert was Director of the Congressional Budget Office. Following CBO, he was a senior fellow in the Economic Studies Program of the Brookings Institution. As a member of the Institute of Medicine, he is a recognized policy expert on the federal budget, Medicare, Social Security, poverty, and welfare, and is past vice chair of the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission.



Michael Gottesman directs the entire Intramural Research Program in basic and medical research at the National Institutes of Health (NIH). He obtained his BA from Harvard College and his MD from Harvard Medical School in 1970. As the Chief of the Laboratory of Cell Biology at the NIH, his research has focused on how cancer cells elude chemotherapy. He has over 500 publications in basic research on cancer. He will speak to us on the latest progress and pitfalls in the war on cancer.





The President Woodrow Wilson House is the home to which President and Mrs. Wilson retired from the White House in 1921. President Wilson lived here until his death in 1924, and Mrs. (Edith) Wilson lived in the home until her death in 1961, at which time she bequeathed the home and its furnishings to the National Trust for Historic Preservation to serve as a monument to President Wilson.
