Introducing Zabdiel Boylston Adams ex 1849, MD 1853, Surgeon & Soldier

In the American Civil War, Zabdiel Boylston Adams served as both a surgeon in the 32nd Massachusetts and an infantry officer in the 56th Massachusetts. A Boston native, he was a descendent of both the Boylston and Adams families of Boston. After initially attending Harvard College, he graduated from Bowdoin College in 1849 and subsequently from Harvard Medical School in 1853.



This presentation by Jon Willen, MD, will discuss the many aspects of Dr. Adams' fascinating life and career. A full three-course Civil-War-era buffet dinner with wine and beer will begin the program.

PROCLAMATION

IN RECOGNITION of her distinguished public service to her country, including her current service as Secretary of Health and Human Services, overseeing a Department with a trillion-dollar budget and one that touches the lives of hundreds of millions of Americans, where she has spearheaded efforts to ensure accessible, affordable, quality healthcare through implementation of the Affordable Care Act while also working to protect the safety of the food we eat and the medications we take, to improve the care we receive, to cure the diseases we confront and prevent them from spreading, to identify and eliminate the causes of racial and ethnic disparities in health, and to ensure that children, families, and seniors have the building blocks of healthy and productive lives; and her prior service as Director of the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), building strong teams and forging relationships to deliver a more orderly budget and appropriations process with sensible long-term reforms and investment in key areas of innovation, education, and infrastructure to help grow our economy, create jobs, and strengthen the middle class; and before that, her service to President Clinton as Deputy Director of OMB, Deputy Chief of Staff to the President, Chief of Staff to the Secretary of the Treasury, and Staff Director of the National Economic Council;

ACKNOWLEDGING that while she left the Appalachian railroad depot at Hinton, West Virginia, for an Ivy League education, a Rhodes scholarship, and the Halls of Power, she never forgot the lessons of community she learned from her 3,000 townspeople, including the mandate that we must never be indifferent toward despair, we must never turn away from helplessness, and we must never ignore or spurn those who suffer untended in a land that is bursting with abundance; that we must use results-oriented methods of proven efficacy to deliver the different kinds of support that people and communities need; that we must dare to be ambitious in living up to our own values, aspiring always to reach beyond our own grasp; and that we must honor those who hear the call to serve by ensuring that we have a future that is worthy of our dreams.

IT IS WITH PRIDE that the Harvard Club of Washington, D.C., whose mission includes actively promoting public service, this 2nd day of December 2015, hereby proclaims Sylvia Mathews Burwell, A.B. '87, distinguished daughter of Harvard, dedicated public servant, resolute guardian of the government's role as a provider of last resort for fellow citizens in need, as the recipient of its **2015 PUBLIC SERVICE AWARD**.
