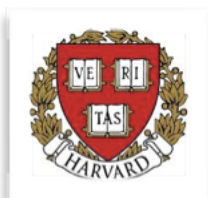

Please join us for the 2015 Annual Meeting of the Harvard Club of Washington, DC. The meeting will be held in the evening on Thursday, June 18, 2015, at the offices of Hogan Lovells at 555 13th Street, NW, Washington, DC 20004. The primary order of business will be the election of officers and directors-at-large.

The Club's Nominating Committee, chaired by Immediate Past President David P. Greene AB '91, MBA '96, has proposed the following slate of officers:

In addition, the Club has 12 director-at-large positions, each for a three-year term, with expiration dates staggered so that four terms expire each year. For the four three-year positions with terms expiring in June 2018, the Nominating Committee nominates Marian C. Bennett AB '66; Alfred M. King AB '54, MBA '59 (to be appointed Assistant Secretary); Kunihiro Matsuda MAUD '73; and Joan Ronnenberg MPA '80. For three positions with terms expiring in June 2017, which are held by current directors who are either proposed for an officer position or stepping down from the Board, the Nominating Committee nominates Courtney Margaret Dagher AB '13; Philippe Le Corre IAF '04; and Todd Theringer MPA '09. For a position with a term expiring in June 2016, which is held by a current director who is stepping down from the Board, the Nominating Committee nominates Karen Biala SM '13.

The Nominating Committee observes that the proposed Board comprises a sufficient number of recent graduates to meet the requirement in Section 4.02(c) of the Club's by-laws that at least four Board members "shall have attended Harvard University . . . within the past ten (10) years when elected."

Finally, the Club offers its profound thanks to these departing Board members for their dedication and service to the Club: William Gray ALM '10; Sade Jimoh AB '09; Anita J. Joseph AB '12; Caroline T. Quazzo AB '12; Jeffrey F. Solnet AB '12; Cora Yamamoto AB '75; and Joanna K. Zawadzki MD '80. We are deeply grateful to them and say a heartfelt farewell.

The Harvard Club of Washington, DC, established the Public Service Award in memory of the late Elliot L. Richardson, AB '40, LLB '47, LLD '72, the former U.S. Attorney General whose life exemplified public service.

As the Club's highest honor, this award is presented annually to an individual who attended or has been affiliate with Harvard University and who has made significant contributions to the public good. The honoree has traditionally also been someone connected to the Washington area.

Past recipients of the award have included former Washington Post editor Benjamin Bradlee, DC Mayor Anthony A. Williams, US Senator Paul Sarbanes, arts leader Earl A. "Rusty" Powell III, US Transportation Secretary William T. Coleman, Jr., former Washington Post Company chairman Donald E. Graham, and US Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg.
