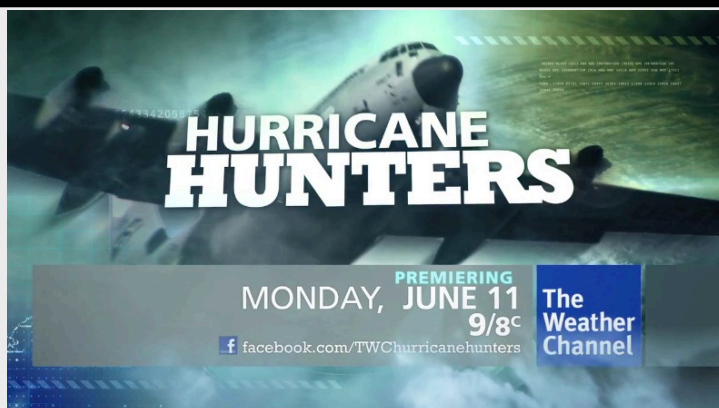

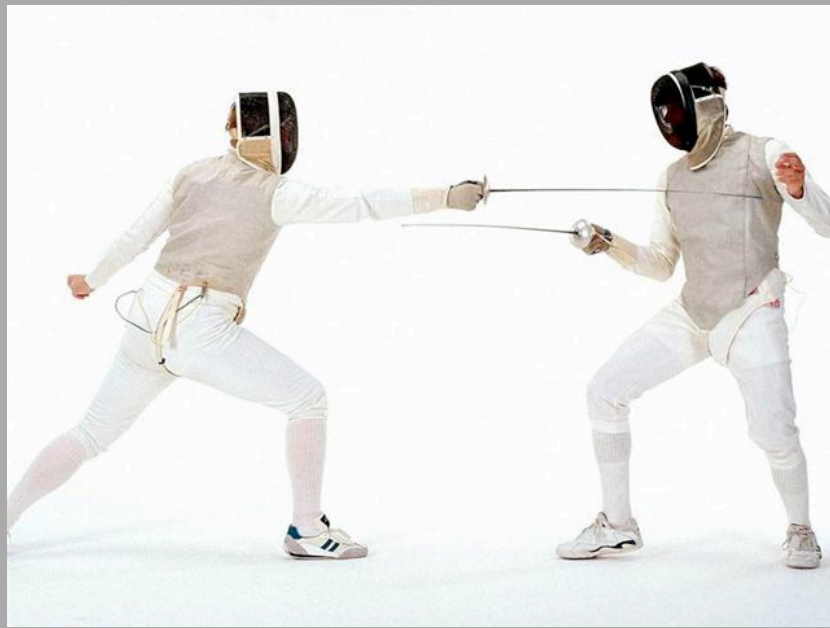

Yarrow Mamout and the History of an American Family

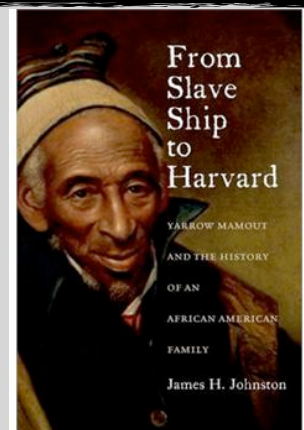

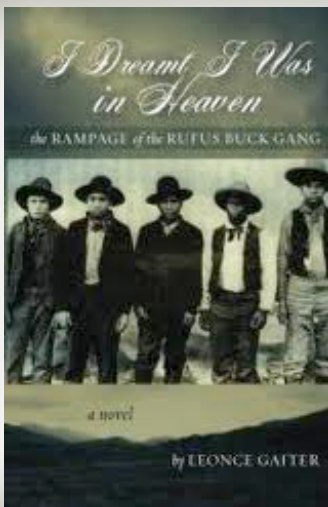
