

Curator-Led Tour of the Baltimore Museum of Art's Exhibit "Kimono and Obi: Romantic Echoes from Japan's Golden Age"



The Baltimore Museum of Art presents an exquisite selection of late 19th to 21st century kimono and obi never before on view. These stunning garments were made after the lifting of sumptuary laws during Japan's Edo period (1603–1867) when commoners were forbidden to wear showy clothing with colors like red or purple. The Meiji Era (1868–1912) coincided with increased prosperity as Japan entered the industrial age and this newfound wealth was often expressed in lavish garments. Many of these kimono

displayed decorative motifs with symbols of the Imperial Court referring to the Heian Era (794–1185), considered Japan's Golden Age when the court was in its most powerful, refined, and romantic period.

Docent-Led Tour of "The Art of the Qur'an: Treasures from the Museum of Turkish and Islamic Arts"



Almost sixty sumptuous manuscripts, created from Herat to Istanbul between the early eighth and the seventeenth century, are featured in *The Art of the Qur'an: Treasures from the Museum of Turkish and Islamic Arts*. This exhibition is the first major presentation of Qur'ans in the US.

Celebrated for their superb calligraphy and lavish illumination, these manuscripts play a significant role in the history of the arts of the book in the Islamic world. The volumes were once the prized possessions of Ottoman sultans, queens, pashas, and viziers, who presented them as gifts to other rulers, as rewards to noblemen, or endowed them to important public institutions. Together, the manuscripts convey stories of personal piety and political power that are explored in this once-in-a-lifetime exhibition.

Docent-Led Tour of Noguchi Exhibit at the Smithsonian American Art Museum



Isamu Noguchi (1904–1988) was among the most innovative American sculptors of the 20th century, striving for timelessness through the abstraction of things, places and ideas. With 74 works, nearly all on loan from The Noguchi Museum in New York, this exhibition provides a fresh interpretation of this modern master, exploring how the ancient world shaped Noguchi's vision for the future.

Even as he created works that were far ahead of his time—his design for Sculpture to Be Seen from Mars (1947) anticipates the space age by several decades—Noguchi frequently found

inspiration in ancient art and architecture, from Egyptian pyramids and Buddhist temples to Zen gardens and American Indian burial mounds. The Smithsonian American Art Museum is the sole venue for this exhibition, which is expanded from an earlier installation at The Noguchi Museum.
